FACILITIES:

The Library

MET’s Library is very well stocked and greatly augments the teaching and learning process. A Digital Library and access to a number of digital online resources add to its repertoire. It is a fully computerized Library and is set up on modern lines. The collection of the Library includes books, periodicals and back volumes. The Library has more than 18,000 books, 90 current periodicals, and a good number of bound volumes of valuable journals. New additions to the Library are brought to the notice of its users through Current Awareness Service. The Library is growing at a fast rate. A Book Bank facility is provided to Under-graduate students.

We are switching over to KOHA, an open source Library software for Library services which will enhance Library use. A repository collection will provide more materials for learning process. Above all, there will be streamlined facility to search world literature in Engineering and Technology through subscriptions and open access. Enormous and relevant literature will be provided for teaching and learning process to the teachers and students

Guidelines for Library use:

1. All the students enrolled in the College are members of the Library.
2. Working hours are from 8.00 a.m. to 6.00 p.m.
3. The U.G. Students are entitled to borrow two books from the general section for a period of 10 days. They can also avail two books each from the Book Bank by paying 25 percent of the cost of the books for a semester. An overdue fine of Rs. 5/- for the first day and Rs. 10/- for subsequent days will be collected for books issued from the general section.
4. PG students are entitled to borrow four books at a time for a period of 15 days. An overdue fine of Rs. 5/- per day per book will be collected.
5. All the students can borrow one reference book for overnight use which will be issued only after 1 p.m. and is to be returned before 11 a.m. on the next working day. An overdue fine of Rs. 20/- for the first day and Rs. 30/- for subsequent days will be collected for late returns.
6. While issuing a book from the library, the user should browse it for loss of pages, underlining or any other damage and should bring to the notice of the library staff. Any discrepancy in the book found on its return or later, the last person to whom the book was issued will be held responsible.
7. When replacing a book on the shelf, make sure that it is in the right place.
8. If a book issued is damaged or lost, three times the cost of the book will be charged.
9. Strict silence should be observed in the Library.
10. Students are permitted to take in only a few sheets of paper or a notebook to the Library for the purpose of writing notes.
11. Students violating Library rules will be barred from using the Library.

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12. ID cards used for issue/return of books are strictly non-exchangeable.
13. Every user entering the Library should mark his/her entry as well as exit, electronically.

Computer Facilities:

Guidelines for availing computer facility

1. Students are allowed to enter the Laboratory only after getting proper permission from the Faculty members during the Laboratory hours.
2. Students are required to enter the Login and logout details, in the respective Log Register.
3. Students are required to submit the printout permission letter approved by the HOD of CSE to take printouts in the Computer Laboratory.
4. Students are required to shutdown the systems properly after finishing the tasks in the Laboratory.
5. Students are required to arrange their respective chairs properly, after finishing the task in the Laboratory.
6. Students are not allowed to use the internet facility to do chatting; it is strictly forbidden in the Laboratory.
7. Students are not allowed to enter in social network sites. It is strictly forbidden in the Laboratory.
8. Students are not allowed to use the external memory devices (pen drive, floppy, CD) and electrical equipment in the Laboratory.
9. Students are not allowed to use any kind of digital devices.
10. Students are not allowed to use Photo Camera, Video Camera etc inside the Laboratory.
11. Students can avail Wi- Fi facility in the laptops
12. Students who want internet facility in their laptops should register their IP address approved by HOD, CSE .
13. Students are not allowed to delete or copy any existing information without prior permission from the college authorities.
14. Writing, Sticking band, bills, posters and disfiguring the Laboratory rooms and doors are strictly prohibited. Violation of this will attract fine & other types of punishments.
15. Students are not permitted to convene meeting of any sort anywhere in the Laboratory premises.
16. No visitors except those officially permitted by the HOD / Principal, are allowed in the Laboratory.

17. No changes of Computer Systems or devices are allowed without the knowledge of the Authorities.
18. Strict silence is to be observed in the Laboratory.
19. Students are responsible for the safe custody of computers/tools / equipment/apparatus they use. Damage or loss of property shall be made good from the students along with a deterrent fine.
20. Proper dress code (Uniform of the College) should be adhered to before entering the Laboratory on all working days.
21. Students are allowed in the Laboratory only during their regular Laboratory hours. For extra Laboratory facility, getting permission from the HOD, CSE is mandatory.

Wi-Fi Facility

Wi-Fi Facility is available 24 X 7 in the whole Campus.

Our College is fully equipped with round the clock internet facility with a speed of 48 Mbps in collaboration with BSNL networks using OFC. The node facility is available for the entire Campus, including Office, Departments, Library, and Hostels etc. All the Computer Laboratories are connected to the Internet. Round the Clock OFC internet connectivity is available for the entire campus including hostels. Faculty members as well as students must register to avail this Wi-Fi facility in the Computer Center.

Computer Centers:

The computing facility of the college consists of a state-of-the-art network of computers with more than 500 nodes spread over multiple Laboratories running with Windows servers, Linux servers and Firewall. Soft Skill Training.

Today lack of competence in soft skill is marked as one of the reasons of poor rate of employability of technical graduates. The centre also acts as a forum to propagate academic excellence with reference to their performance in KTU exams with active support with concerned HODs. RESEARCH AND CONSULTANCY

MET's Research and Consultancy Centre (MRCC)

MRCC is the apex body that coordinates the research activities of the different research groups at MET's. There is an Animator in-charge of the MRCC. Each group has a number of students who carry out research on specialized areas under the guidance of Faculty Members. Students with talents, initiative and motivation can design and develop projects in different areas. Such activities can be embarked upon by students in the third semester onwards.

Department of Biotechnology

Centre For Biotechnology

Centre for Biotechnology is the Research & Development (R & D) Wing of Department of Biotechnology Engineering. The R & D laboratory, funded by Department of Atomic Energy, Govt. of India was inaugurated by Padmasri Dr. Srikumar Banerjee, Chairman, Atomic Energy Commission in 2011.

The laboratory is equipped with modern analytical instruments such as Gas Chromatograph, Spectrophotometer, Centrifuges, Fermenters etc. Research projects funded by Kerala State Council for Science, Technology and Environment (KSCSTE) and other Government agencies are also being implemented in the R & D laboratory.

Research projects

A major research project on 'Process Development For Preservation and Value Addition of Jack Fruit' was implemented recently with funding (Rs.17 lakhs) from Department of Atomic Energy, Government of India. Thirteen short term research projects have been completed with funding from KSCSTE.

The Center for Biotechnology has two on-going collaborative research projects with Kerala Forest Research Institute, Peechi. Faculty members also offer consultancy services in setting up of extraction, distillation and fractionation units /plants.

The Department of Biotechnology is a KTU recognized department for doing research for Ph.D degree in Biotechnology. Dr. M Balasundaran & Dr. P C Madhu are recognized research supervisors for Biotechnology.

Department of Civil Engineering

Research Work

The Civil Engineering Department has three research centers in different fields of specialization. The following list has the details of various centers .

1. Centre for Structural Engineering
2. Centre for Soil Structural Interaction.
3. Centre for Water Resource Management.

The main objective of these centers is to update the technical development in construction area and provide a vibrant ambiance for knowledge sharing and disseminate the same among academicians , students and practicing Engineers.

Consultation Projects

The department is also well equipped with laboratories to take up consultation projects over testing of building materials like cement, aggregate, steel, concrete cubes and blocks as consultancy projects.

Code of Conduct

The working hours of MET's are from 9.00 a.m. to 4.00 p.m. on all working days. Students should not come late for their lectures. At the stroke of the second bell in the morning, students shall stand up for the Prayer song.

1. Students should wear the uniform, complete with their identity Tags, on all working days. Identity tags are compulsory.
2. Medium of communication is English in the campus

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3. Students are expected to greet their teachers when they meet them for the first time in the day. Their language and behaviour should be always polite. When teachers enter classes, students should stand up until the teachers indicate that they can resume their seats.
4. Misbehavior to members of the opposite sex or staff members will be considered as serious cases of misconduct.
5. Students should make it a habit to peruse the General Notice Board for fresh information.
6. Students should realize that 'Cleanliness is next to Godliness'. They must endeavor to keep their classrooms and surroundings clean. The properties of the College must be properly taken care of by them. If students cause damage to the College property deliberately, compensation as decided by the authorities will have to be paid by them.
7. Smoking and drinking alcoholic beverages and use of narcotics of any form are strictly banned in the Campus. Recalcitrant behavior in the class room or campus, general neglect of studies or duties assigned to them will be considered as serious offences.
8. Birthday celebrations or other festivities should not be conducted in the class rooms or campus during regular working hours.
9. Students are advised not to bring their outside friends to the Institution during working hours or during the various programmes conducted by the Institution, unless specifically permitted by the Principal.
10. As per the Government directive, mobile phones are banned in the Campus. Valuables like gold ornaments etc. should not be brought to the Campus.
11. Students who wish to bring their vehicles (two- wheelers or four-wheelers) into the campus must get vehicle entry permit in the prescribed format. Vehicle entry permits in the form of stickers will be issued for a period of one academic year. Students who bring their two wheelers or other vehicles without valid entry permit will be penalized.
12. A speed limit of 15Km/hr is to be strictly observed in the Campus. Any vehicle exceeding the speed limit will be barred from the Campus.
13. Students are expected to follow the normal regulations regarding helmets and seat belts.

13. Ragging is strictly prohibited. Any instance of ragging will immediately be reported to the Police. Offenders will be dismissed from the Institution forthwith.
14. Politics is strictly banned in the Campus. No student should act as an agent of any political party or communal outfit.
15. Students are prohibited from organizing any meetings. They must not collect any funds for whatever reason. They are prohibited from displaying any notice and sending out any circular or display placards of any kind without the written permission from the Principal.
16. Writing, sticking bands, bills, posters and disfiguring walls and the Laboratory rooms and doors are strictly prohibited.
17. Low waist pants are not permitted in the Campus.
18. Unauthorized Flex, Banners & Placards are totally banned in the campus.

Rules of Attendance and Leave

1. For eligibility to be admitted for the University examination, a student should have a minimum attendance as per University norms.
- 2 Attendance shortage will not be condoned at the University level unless the absence is regularized by a leave application. Application forms are available in the office and in the hostels.
3. How to get leave sanctioned:
 - Duly filled and signed application form should be presented to the teacher- in- charge.
 - If the attendance percentage is below 90% at any stage, the student has to meet the HOD after meeting the teacher-in-charge.
 - If the attendance is below 80% at any stage, the student has to meet the Principal, after meeting the teacher-in-charge and the HOD.
4. Leave application is to be forwarded by the teacher-in- charge to the HOD and in turn to the Principal who may grant the leave. When leave of absence is required for more than three consecutive days, the application must be supported by medical certificate.
5. Only the Principal can grant leave of absence from an examination with the recommendation of the concerned Faculty Member or the HOD.

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6. A student who absents himself or herself for more than 10 consecutive working days will be removed from the rolls. He/she will be readmitted only on payment of readmission fees and penalty, if any.
7. The Principal will carry out random checking of the attendance records and unauthorized absenteeism will be strictly dealt with.
8. Duty leave should be recommended by concerned authorities immediately.

Tests and Examinations

1. Students should take all the examinations and tests. Absence from a test will affect their sessional marks.
2. There will be daily tests to assess student progress, culminating in two Series Tests each semester. Periodical assignments will also be there.

Students should note:

1. Monthly and Series tests will be based mainly on the modules covered during the period prior to the tests. The final test may include all the modules.
2. Non-submission of assignment will result in the reduction of sessional marks.
3. Progress reports will be sent to the parents. Marks will also be available online.
4. Open house will be conducted for parent-teacher interaction.
5. At the end of the Semester, students are required to obtain the “No Dues” form and submit it in the office before hall tickets are issued. The forms are available in the office
6. The decision of the Academic Council on all matters related to sessional marks /examinations/tests will be final.
7. Students have to keep all the records related to their internal assessment and they have to submit all on demand.

PTA

The college has got a well functioning PTA committee.

Payment of Fees

Yearly fees have to be remitted on or before 1st of June.

Cancellation and Discontinuation of Admission

Requests for cancellation/ discontinuation of admission by students in the Free/Payment seat category will be allowed only at the instance of written direction from the Entrance Commissioner. In the cases pertaining to the above mentioned categories, rules and regulations as specified in the prospectus issued by the Office of the Entrance Commissioner from time to time are binding.

In cases of students admitted under management category, admission once taken cannot be cancelled nor is it allowed to discontinue the course, or leave the Institution. In the event of a management category student discontinuing the course or leaving the Institution for any reason he/she is liable to pay the complete fees (tuition fees and special fees) for four years (the entire course period) as liquidated damages. In such cases the Transfer Certificate shall be issued to the student only after the payment of the fees for four years. However, the decision of the Management in such matters shall be deemed as final.

National Service Scheme

The College has a unit of the NSS working under Calicut University. Prof. K.N.Ramesh, who is the member, Advisory Committee and District Coordinator Thrissur of NSS, Calicut University, is in-charge of the local unit. The NSS undertakes various activities related to the economic, cultural and environmental needs of the people. Further, Merit Awards, Proficiency Awards and Gold Medals will be given to University Rank Holders.

Perfect Attendance Award:

Students getting 100% attendance will be given befitting awards.

The Honours List:

The names of students who get Ranks in the University Examinations will be exhibited in the Hall of Fame.

Scholarships:

Students who are extraordinarily meritorious will be considered for Scholarship awards.

Scholarships and Stipends

MOMA Scholarship

(Ministry of Minority Affairs) for Fresh /Renewal

MOMA scholarship is also known as Merit Cum Means Scholarship. Christian/Muslim students are eligible. Annual income of the family shall not exceed Rs. 2.5 Lakh.

Students admitted under management/NRI are also eligible. Above 50% marks in the qualifying Examination is not a must. Aadhar is now optional. Income Certificate from Revenue Authorities in original is required.

E. Grantz Scholarship

SC/ST & OEC students No Income Limit

Govt. will reimburse ABLC in case of Hostellers and they will get Pocket Money of Rs. 150/- per month. For day scholars of SC/ST & OEC, will get monthly stipend of Rs. 500/- , Rs. 600/- based on the distance of their residence from the College. In addition, Tuition fee, Exam fee & Special fee will be reimbursed by Govt. Tuition fee is to the College and the Exam fee & Special Fee are to the students (for SC, ST & OEC students).

Forward community students /SEBC students can apply for Scholarship subject to the following conditions.

1.Their annual family income shall not exceed Rs. 42000/- and their allotment should be under Govt. Quota

FC/SEBC students will get Rs. 200/- per month as stipend based on Day scholar/ Hosteller. Besides they will get Rs. 4000/- per year towards tuition fee & Exam fee (vary) / Special fee (vary). All these amounts are due to the students.

Mode of Applying

Students forward application through Akshaya Centers. They have to submit a print out of the application in the office along with the following documents.

- Original Income Certificate
- Original Caste Certificate
- Copy of the allotment Memo issued by the Entrance Commissioner
- Copy of Aadhar
- Copy of SSLC book
- Copy of Plus Two Certificate
- Copy of Bank A/c Passbook of the student along with IFSC Code

Central Sector Scholarship

Applicant should have score a minimum of 80% marks in the Plus Two or VHSE Examinations and the parental income should not exceed Rs. 6 Lakh per annum. Applicant should not be awaiting any other scholarship or familiar assistance.

Rate of scholarship: Rs. 1000 per month of first three years, subject to a maximum Rs.10,000 for an academic year and Rs. 2000 per month for subject to a maximum of RS.20,000 for 4th year of study.

PRAGATHI Scholarship (AICTE)

4000 scholarships are available all over India. One girl from a family is eligible to apply.

Rate of scholarship: Rs. 30,000 per annum as course fee. Rs. 2500 per month as stipend.

Post Metric Scholarship for economically weaker section of minorities.

The above scholarship will be awarded to the students who belong to minority communities. He/she have secured not less than 50% marks in previous final examination with an annual income not exceeding Rs. 2 Lakh. Rs. 3000 per annum is the rate of scholarship. 30% of scholarships will be marked for girl students and preference will be given to BPL families.

Prime Minister's Scholarship for Central Armed Police Forces and Assam Rifles

2000 scholarships are available totally. Department wards and widows of Central Armed Police Forces and Assam Rifles having minimum 60% marks are eligible to apply. Rs.2250 per month for girls and Rs.2000 for boys is the rate.

C H Mohammed Koya Scholarship

Only girl student belong to Muslim/Latin Catholic/converted Christian and permanent natives of Kerala are eligible. Students those who are admitted in merit with a annual family income below Rs. 4.5 Lakh can apply. Minimum 50% marks are necessary. Rs. 6000 per annum is the rate of this Scholarship.
